• Opening Sentences and Advent Candle Lighting

A voice cries out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord." A choir sings in the silence, "Come, Emmanuel." Every valley shall be filled. Every heart shall be made whole, for peace is stronger than turmoil, and love is louder than hate. As we light our second Advent candle, we pray for the holy peace of God. Come now, O Child of Mary. Come now, O Prince of Peace.

Come now, O Prince of Peace, make us one body. Come, O Lord Jesus; reconcile all people. Advent is a season of tension and paradox: a period of four weeks during which we expectantly wait for the One who has already come.
