Call to Confession

Lent is the 40 day season before Easter. Originally, it was a time of preparing candidates for baptism on Easter. Over the centuries it has evolved into a time devoted to renewing our understanding of what it means to be a follower of Christ. We observe Lent in anticipation of the resurrection, and we celebrate Easter remembering the cost of the cross's life-giving victory.

We will begin worship during Lent with *Be Still and Know*. Today, the choir will sing it for us and each Sunday hereafter, we will sing it together.

The ritual of **confession and forgiveness** is not a time of judgment; it is a time of grace. It is not a time to fear God; it is a time to experience God's unending love through Jesus. It is a time to take a load off our shoulders so that we might more freely live.

Greet those near you with the blessing: "May the peace of Christ be with you."

After each reading, the liturgist says: "The word of the Lord." The congregation responds: "**Thanks be to God.**"

## MISSION
